### **Structured Work Place Learning On-the-Job Training:**

- Work placement is not compulsory
- An industry visit and report is required

### **VCE Unit status:**

- Students who complete Certificate III in Concept Development for Clothing Products will be eligible for four units credit towards their VCE: two units at Unit 1-2 and a Unit 3-4 sequence

### **VCAL Unit Status:**

- When a student has been assessed as competent in units of competence totalling 100 nominal hours, this will contribute one VCAL unit towards satisfactory completion of the VCAL.

### **ENTER Contribution:**

- Students who receive a Units 3 and 4 sequence for LMT31407 will be eligible for a 10% increment towards their ENTER (10% of the average of the primary four scaled studies).

### **Duplication: (if any)**

No significant duplication has been identified between the VCE VET Applied Fashion Design and Technology program and VCE studies or other VCE VET programs.
