What does the LLEN do?

The Local Learning and Employment Network aims to retain and re-engage young people 15 to 19 in education to the completion of Year 12 or its equivalent.

We work with our members to achieve this by: **Resources** like the Life After School Guide and Who Ya Gonna Call?

Networks Events for Transition Support and VCAL providing peer professional development, information sharing & networking.

Annual Regional Conferences to bring the knowledge of experts to the South East on topics of common interest like Partnerships and Young People with Complex Needs.

On Track Connect to provide information, support & referral to young people and their families during times of transition between education, training & employment.

Facilitating Shared Planning between organisations to ensure that young people are receiving equitable services

Convening Local Leadership to strategically address local issues affecting young people's success in education.

Participating in Local Leadership steering committees, reference groups, working groups and project teams.

Providing information to our members about new initiatives and opportunities for young people and those who work with them in the South East.
